
Level 1 & Level 2 dates for August & September are now available to book via TURAS - Please see the pathway below to help you in booking the correct course for your role.


Communities Mental Health and Wellbeing Fund for Adults

The Scottish Government recently announced an additional 15 Million pounds for a third year of the Communities Mental Health and Wellbeing Fund for Adults for 2023/24. The Fund has now provided around 3,300 grants to community organisations delivering mental health and wellbeing support, bringing total investment to £51 million.

Activities will target older people, areas of economic deprivation, people with long-term health conditions or disability and LGBTI communities. The Fund has also had a particular focus on responding to the cost-of-living crisis, which remains a priority this year.

Dear CPCScotland members

Through CSE Aware we have been developing new resources across the settings of the impact of Commercial Sexual Exploitation on different aspects of womens lives.

We have been linking with practitioners to find out the range of challenges and obstacles there may be to providing support to women involved and we have been engaging with women who are / have been involved in selling or exchanging sex to find out the challenges they can face when accessing services and / or disclosing their experiences.

We have developed a short survey for frontline staff to explore **challenges that women and workers face** regarding disclosures of selling or exchanging sex, and discuss what relevant **supports workers need**. All of this information will be used to develop new information, briefings and resources for practitioners and front line staff. The link to the survey is

AWI, in practice - Masterclass

In May 2021, the Mental Welfare Commission of Scotland published 'Authority to Discharge' report. Following this, the Scottish Government agreed to fund a short life project to support a national approach to learning and applying the requirements of the Adults with Incapacity (Scotland) Act 2000, also known as AWI, in practice. The project aims to develop educational resources and opportunities

to address gaps in knowledge across the health, social work and social care workforce in relation to application of AWI.

The AWI Project are now delighted to announce the <u>Turas Learn Once for Scotland: AWI page</u> is now live.
